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This Privacy Policy describes our policies and procedures on the collection, use and disclosure of your information when you use the Service and tells you about your privacy rights and how the law protects you.

we use your data to provide and improve the Service. By using the Service, you agree to the collection and use of information in accordance with this Privacy Policy. This Privacy Policy has been created with the help of the Privacy Policy Generator.

Interpretation and Definitions

Interpretation

The words of which the initial letter is capitalized have meanings defined under the following conditions. The following definitions shall have the same meaning regardless of whether they appear singular or plural.

Definitions

For this Privacy Policy:

Account means an individual account created for you to access our Service or parts of our Service.

Affiliate means an entity that controls is controlled by or is under common control with a party, where "control" means ownership of 50% or more of the shares, equity interest or other securities entitled to vote for the election of directors or other managing authority.

College (referred to as either "the College", "we", "us", or "our" in this Agreement) refers to College of Remote and Offshore Medicine, 42 Zebra Street, BIrzebbuga, Malta.

Cookies are small files placed on your computer, mobile device or any other device by a website, containing the details of your browsing history on that website among its many uses.

Country refers to Malta

Device means any device that can access the Service, such as a computer, a cellphone or a digital tablet.

Personal Data is any information that relates to an identified or identifiable individual.

Service refers to the website.

Service Provider means any natural or legal person who processes the data on behalf of the College. It refers to third-party companies or individuals employed by the College to facilitate the Service, to provide the Service on behalf of the College, to perform services related to the Service or to assist the College in analyzing how the Service is used.

usage Data refers to data collected automatically, either generated by the use of the Service or from the Service infrastructure itself (for example, the duration of a page visit).

website refers to College of Remote and Offshore Medicine, accessible from

you mean the individual accessing or using the Service, the College, or other legal entity on behalf of which such individual is accessing or using the Service, as applicable.

Collecting and using your Personal Data

Types of Data Collected

Personal Data

While using our Service, we may ask you to provide us with certain personally identifiable information that can be used to contact or identify you. Personally identifiable information may include, but is not limited to:

- Email address
- First name and last name
- usage Data

usage Data

usage Data has collected automatically when using the Service.

usage Data may include information such as your Device's Internet Protocol address (e.g. IP address), browser type, browser version, the pages of our Service that you visit, the time and date of your visit, the time spent on those pages, unique device identifiers and other diagnostic data.

When you access the Service by or through a mobile device, we may collect certain information automatically, including, but not limited to, the type of mobile device you use, your mobile device unique ID, the IP address of your mobile device, your mobile operating system, the type of mobile Internet browser you use, unique device identifiers and other diagnostic data.

we may also collect information that your browser sends whenever you visit our Service or when you access the Service by or through a mobile device.

Tracking Technologies and Cookies

we use Cookies and similar tracking technologies to track the activity on our Service and store certain information. Tracking technologies are beacons, tags, and scripts to collect and track information and improve and analyze our Service. The technologies we use may include:

- **Cookies or Browser Cookies.** A cookie is a small file placed on your Device. you can instruct your browser to refuse all Cookies or to indicate when a cookie is being sent. However, if you do not accept Cookies, you may be unable to use some parts of our Service. Unless you have adjusted your browser setting so that it will refuse cookies, our Service may use Cookies.
- **web Beacons.** Certain sections of our Service and our emails may contain small electronic files known as web beacons (also referred to as clear gifs, pixel tags, and single-pixel gifs) that permit the College, for example, to count users who have visited those pages or opened an email and for other related website statistics (for example, recording the popularity of a specific section and verifying system and server integrity).

Cookies can be "Persistent" or "Session" Cookies. Persistent Cookies remain on your personal computer or mobile device when you go offline, while Session Cookies are deleted as soon as you close your web browser. Learn more about cookies on the Privacy Policies website article.

we use both Sessions and Persistent Cookies for the purposes set out below:

Necessary / Essential Cookies

Type: Session Cookies

Administered by: us

Purpose: These Cookies are essential to provide you with services available through the website and to enable you to use some of its features. They help to authenticate users and prevent fraudulent use of user accounts. Without these Cookies, the services that you have asked for cannot be provided, and we only use these Cookies to offer you those services.

use of your Personal Data

The College may use Personal Data for the following purposes:

To provide and maintain our Service, including monitoring the usage of our Service.

To manage your Account: to manage your registration as a Service user. The Personal Data you provide can give you access to different Service functionalities as a registered user.

For the performance of a contract: the development, compliance and undertaking of the purchase contract for the products, items or services you have purchased or of any other agreement with us through the Service.

To contact you: To contact you by email, telephone calls, SMS, or other equivalent forms of electronic communication, such as a mobile application's push notifications regarding updates or informative communications related to the functionalities, products or contracted services, including the security updates, when necessary or reasonable for their implementation.

To manage your requests: To attend to and manage your requests to us.

For business transfers: we may use your information to evaluate or conduct a merger, divestiture, restructuring, reorganization, dissolution, or other sale or transfer of some or all of our assets, whether as a going concern or as part of bankruptcy, liquidation, or similar proceeding, in which Personal Data held by us about our Service users is among the assets transferred.

For other purposes: we may use your information for other purposes, such as data analysis, identifying usage trends, determining the effectiveness of our promotional campaigns and evaluating and improving our Service, products, services, marketing and your experience.

we may share your personal information in the following situations:

- **With other users:** when you share personal information or otherwise interact in the online areas with other users, such information may be viewed by all users and publicly distributed outside.
- **With your consent:** we may disclose your personal information for any other purpose but only with your consent.

Retention of your Personal Data

The College will retain your Data only for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out in this Privacy Policy. we will retain and use your Data to the extent necessary to comply with our legal obligations (for example, if we are required to retain your data to comply with applicable laws), resolve disputes, and enforce our legal agreements and policies.

The College will also retain usage Data for internal analysis purposes. usage Data is generally kept for a shorter period, except when this data is used to strengthen the security or improve the functionality of our Service. we are legally obligated to retain this data for more extended periods.

Transfer of your Personal Data

your information, including Personal Data, is processed at the College's operating offices and in any other places where the parties involved in the processing are located. This information may be transferred to — and maintained on — computers outside your state, province, country or other governmental jurisdiction where the data protection laws may differ from those from your authority.

your consent to this Privacy Policy, followed by your submission of such information, represents your Agreement to that transfer.

The College will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Policy, and no transfer of your Personal Data will take place to an organization or a country unless there are adequate controls in place, including the security of your data and other personal information.

Delete your Personal Data

you have the right to delete or request that we assist in deleting the Personal Data we have collected about you.

our Service may allow you to delete certain information about you from within the Service.

you may update, amend, or delete your information at any time by signing in to your Account, if you have one, and visiting the account settings section that allows you to manage your data. you may also contact us to request access to, correct, or delete any personal information you provided.

Please note, however, that we may need to retain certain information when we have a legal obligation or lawful basis to do so.

Disclosure of your Personal Data

Business Transactions

If the College is involved in a merger, acquisition or asset sale, your Personal Data may be transferred. we will provide notice before your Personal Data is transferred and becomes subject to a different Privacy Policy.

Law enforcement

Under certain circumstances, the College may be required to disclose your Data if required to do so by law or in response to valid requests by public authorities (e.g. a court or a government agency).

Other legal requirements

The College may disclose your Data in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to:

- Comply with a legal obligation
- Protect and defend the rights or property of the College
- Prevent or investigate possible wrongdoing in connection with the Service
- Protect the personal safety of users of the Service or the public
- Protect against legal liability

Security of your Personal Data

The security of your Personal Data is important to us, but remember that no method of transmission over the Internet or method of electronic storage is 100% secure. While we strive to use commercially acceptable means to protect your Personal Data, we cannot guarantee its absolute security.

Children's Privacy

our Service does not address anyone under the age of 13, and we do not knowingly collect personally identifiable information from anyone under the age of 13.
